<p><b>ISB hours</b></p>	<p>The school day starts at 8:00, and students are expected to be in their classroom by that time. Classrooms are open from 7:50. Students arriving before 7:50 must join the Morning Club in the canteen. Morning Club opens at 7:00. Homeroom teachers take attendance at 8:00, so any students arriving after that will be marked as late. ISB closes at 17:00 (16:00 on Fridays).</p>
<p><b>Unit of Inquiry</b></p>	<p>In the Primary Years Programme (PYP), the Unit of Inquiry combines different subjects to explore a big idea. Each year, students take part in six units each linked to one of six themes that they revisit yearly. By connecting subjects like maths, art, PE, language, and social studies, students not only learn specific skills but also gain a better understanding of how everything fits together in the world around them.</p>
<p><b>Dansk</b></p>	<p>At ISB, Danish is taught through two approaches: Danish Language &amp; Literature (primarily for students who have Danish as a home or family language), and Danish Acquisition (for students who are learning Danish as an additional language).</p>
<p><b>Assembly</b></p>	<p>Assemblies are a key part of bringing our school community together. We have cluster-specific assemblies for focused connection within clusters and collaborative assemblies where different grade levels engage in joint activities. Additionally, our whole primary assemblies involve the Danish tradition of <i>fællessang</i>. Each assembly format fosters unity, collaboration and a shared sense of belonging among students.</p>
<p><b>Visual Arts Music &amp; Drama</b></p>	<p>Drama, music, and visual art are pathways for students to express themselves creatively and explore diverse cultures. <b>Drama</b> encourages expression through body language and acting techniques, fostering emotional and cultural understanding. <b>Music</b> enriches communication and cultural appreciation through a variety of musical genres and styles. <b>Visual art</b> promotes creativity and critical thinking by exposing students to different techniques and materials, nurturing appreciation for cultural diversity.</p>
<p><b>PE</b></p>	<p>PE at ISB offers a variety of activities including athletics, sports, dance and games to develop physical skills, teamwork, and healthy habits. It supports student well-being through active learning experiences that encourage lifelong enjoyment of movement. For PE-lessons students need a PE-bag with comfortable clothes, shoes and a towel. Showering is required for students in P2 and up.</p>
<p><b>Fri for Mobberi</b></p>	<p>Fri for Mobberi (Free of Bullying) is integrated into our school to strengthen community bonds and nurture inclusive environments. While there is one dedicated lesson each week specifically focused on <i>Fri for Mobberi</i>, its principles spread through the whole curriculum. Tolerance, respect, care and courage are all ISB values and a part of <i>Fri for Mobberi</i>.</p>
<p><b>After School Club</b></p>	<p>After School Club starts at 14:00 and offers students a range of engaging activities designed to promote social interaction, creativity and fun. After School Club provides a safe and inclusive environment where children can unwind, make friends and explore their interests through free play, structured games and creative activities.</p>
